Director's Notes

Welcome back!

The cast of *Jeeves Intervenes* came together on January 11 to start rehearsal, and several of us noted that it felt like a renewal. *Jeeves Saves the Day* was the last play NC Stage produced before everything shut down in 2020, and for most of us, this is our first time working on a play since then. We have missed it, and you.

It has always been fun for me to work on these funny plays, full of wordplay and hijinks, in the darkest months of the winter. The familiar rhythms of these stories and characters take on the role of comfort food—Bertie and Jeeves are the mac and cheese of the theatrical buffet. The wonderful thing about comfort food is that you know just what you're getting, and the Jeeves stories are ones I return to over and over, like my favorite recipes.

Jeeves Intervenes gives us P.G. Wodehouse at his best: terrifying Aunt Agatha, forever plotting to get Bertie safely wed; Bertie's hapless friend Eustace, in love and penniless; the frighteningly intellectual Gertrude, earmarked for Bertie's hand; and the retired military officer Sir Rupert, keeping an eye on his nephew Eustace's activities. Their wants, needs, and deepest desires collide right in Bertie's London flat, and only the inimitable Jeeves can sort it out.

We are so glad that you're here. I hope *Jeeves Intervenes* brings you delight, laughs, and, of course, comfort.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Margaret Raether first encountered P.G. Wodehouse in the form of a battered secondhand paperback of *The Code of the Woosters* when she was in college. This, as Bogart once famously observed, was "the beginning of a beautiful friendship," as she promptly fell in love with the style, the wit, and the inimitable mastery of language. Her P.G. Wodehouse adaptations have been described as "bright and engaging as a garden party in May" (Chicago Tribune) and her writing "wonderfully captures the late British humorist's renowned wit" (Seattle Times). Margaret's plays are generally pounded out late at night while peering awkwardly around a cat that likes to plop down directly in front of the monitor.

N.Y.C. theater credits include: Stott in *Public Enemy* at The Pearl Theater Company, The Lieutenant in Ariel Dorfman's NYC premier of *Widows at 59East59th St.*, and Logger in Eisa Davis's Pulitzer

Prize nominated *Bullrusher* at Urban Stages. TV and film credits include; *FBI: Most Wanted, For Life, Prodigal Son, The Black List, Blue Bloods, House of Cards,* and *Julie and Julia*. Guiesseppe is an alumnus of The American Conservatory Theater in San Francisco.



Faith Lavon* (Gertrude Winsklesworth-Bode)

Ms. Lavon left Kansas right after high school to study at Chapman University in Orange, CA and graduated from Joanne Baron and D.W. Brown Studios in Santa Monica, CA. She was also honored with a directing internship at the prestigious South Coast Repertory Theatre in Costa Mesa, CA. Ms. Lavon is very proud that she honed her acting skills in the theatre, including roles with HBO Workspace, Grove Shakespeare, and South Coast Repertory. Her one-woman show, *Women On The Verge*, not only won Best Dramatic Script at the United Solo Festival in New

York but in 2018 the show won Best One Person Show at the NAACP Theatre Awards LA. She has appeared on the screen in *General Hospital*, 90210, and commercials such as AT&T/Hertz, and most recently the Amazon Low Prices campaign and a variety of web series and short films. Her talents can currently be seen in the upcoming short film Lola directed by Ana Lydia Monaco and Bandwidth directed by Pat Battistini both of which are making the festival rounds now. Her very own short film Our Saturday Talks is in pre-production, coming out in 2022. She is the author of Nobody Knows But God v1 and is set to release v2 The Journey Forward later this year.

Callan is a Theatre Professor at Western Carolina University. She dedicates this show to her mother who celebrates her 96th birthday during this run! 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
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
