As an actor, he's worked regionally in theatre & film including Flat Rock Playhouse, Florida Studio Theatre, and as an 8 year resident company member at Barter Theatre. Previous shows at NC Stage company include *Handle With Care*, *All Is Calm*, *Frost/Nixon*, and *King Mackerel And The Blues Are Running*. As a composer, he's had musicals produced at Barter Theatre, South Carolina Children's Theatre, Flat Rock Playhouse, HART,

and Dock Street Theatre. As a singer/songwriter, he's toured everywhere from local breweries to Lincoln Center in NYC with his harmony driven string band, *The Blue Eyed Bettys*. Playwright Bio

Samuel D. Hunter grew up in Moscow, Idaho and lives in New York City. He is the recipient of a 2014 MacArthur "Genius Grant" Fellowship for his work as a playwright. His full-length plays include *The Whale* (Drama Desk Award, Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding Play, GLAAD Media Award, Drama League and Outer Critics Circle nominations for Best Play), *A Case for the Existence of God* (New



York Drama Critics' Award for Best Play), A Bright New Boise (Obie Award, Drama Desk nomination for Best Play), Clements Greater (Drama Desk nomination for Best Play, Outer Critics Circle Honoree), Lewiston/Clarkston (Drama Desk nomination for Best Play), The Few, A Great Wilderness, Rest, Pocatello, The Healing and The Harvest, among others. A film version of The Whale, directed by Darren Aronofsky and starring

Brendan Fraser, is set to be released by A24 Films. He is the recipient of a 2012 Whiting Writers Award and an honorary doctorate from the University of Idaho. His work has been produced off-Broadway in New York City by Lincoln Center Theatre, Playwrights Horizons, LCT3, Signature Theatre, Page 73 Productions, Clubbed Thumb and Rattlestick Playwrights Theatre. Elsewhere, his work has been produced by Theatre Royal Bath, Dallas Theatre Center, Seattle Rep, Denver Center for the Performing Arts, Woolly Mammoth Theatre Company, South Coast Rep, and Victory Gardens, among others. Two published anthologies of his work are available from TCG Books, and a third is forthcoming. He is a member of New Dramatists and a current Resident Playwright at the Signature Theatre in New York City. He holds degrees in playwriting from NYU, The Iowa Playwrights Workshop, and Juilliard.

Charlie Flynn-McIver (Director) is the artistic director and co-founder, with his wife, Angie Flynn-McIver, of NC Stage. He has appeared most recently in Jeeves Intervenes, A Doll's House Part 2, and Stones in His Pockets as well as NC Stage's world premieres of Someone Else and Stalking the Bogeyman. At Flat Rock Playhouse, he appeared in The Odd Couple, 12 Angry Men and The 39 Steps. Some NC Stage credits include: Hamlet, Loot, Art, All in the Timing, Chesapeake, and Macbeth. National tour: Wit with Judith Light. Off Broadway: Ice Island, the Wait for Shackleton. Directing credits for NC Stage include: The Book Club Play, The Understudy, R. Charlie has a Bachelor of Music in Music Theatre from Shenandoah Conservatory of Music and an MFA in acting from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Casey Watkins (Costume Design) A native of Wilmington, NC, Casey Watkins received her BA from NC State University and her MFA in Costume Design from Southern Illinois University. She has worked, designed and taught at various places such as North Carolina Theatre, Porthouse Theatre, Monomoy Theatre, McLeod Summer Playhouse, Valdosta State University, and Texas A&M University Commerce. Her academic work concentrates on the intersection of clothing, culture, and performance, decolonizing theatre practices and pedagogy, and interdisciplinary collaboration. She is currently an assistant professor at UNC Asheville.

Sylvia J. Pierce (*Props Artist*) is a life-long theatre enthusiast playing one of Ole King Cole's fiddlers at age 4. She pursued technical theatre in grad school, deciding she'd rather be a techie than a conceptual designer. Starting out professionally in Cambridge, MA in 1978, she worked her way South, through New York City, Atlanta and all over the US and abroad for the next two decades. Along the way she built and managed shows for theatre and broadcast television events, joined IATSE Local #4, built lots of sets, owned two companies, went on the road, and finally moved slightly north to Asheville. Finding that the mountains felt like home, she finally gave up her nomadic lifestyle and settled down. Now, she works and builds for local theatre companies and is enjoying this phase of her career.
