What drew me to this play was the opportunity to showcase a different side of an icon. History has a tendency to flatten real people into short and digestible factoids. Thurgood, like many other titans of history, was a three dimensional man. Full of humor, wit, contradictions and flaws like everyone else. We are aiming to showcase the ordinary man within the extraordinary leader, because all of us are capable of breaking down barriers in our lives and facilitating change.

In crafting this experience, my sincerest hope is that the audience leaves with a better understanding of Justice Marshall and the story of our country at large. History has a way of echoing forward, and there are many parts of this story that speak to what we are going through today. As we approach seventy years since the landmark Brown vs. the Board of Education decision, many things have changed for the better, but we still have further to go.

Starting out professionally in Cambridge, MA in 1978, she worked her way South, through New York City, Atlanta and all over the US and abroad for the next two decades. Along the way she built and managed shows for theatre and broadcast television events, joined IATSE Local #4, built lots of sets, owned two companies, went on the road, and finally moved slightly north to Asheville. Finding that the mountains felt like home, she finally gave up her nomadic lifestyle and settled down. Now, she works and builds for local theatre companies and is enjoying this phase of her career.

George Stevens, Jr. (*Playwright*) George Stevens, Jr's interest in Thurgood Marshall began with a miniseries he wrote and directed, *Separate But Equal*, the story of the Brown vs. Board of Education school desegregation case on which Marshall was the lawyer for the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. *Thurgood* is his first play. Stevens is the founder of the American Film Institute and a writer, director, and producer. Motion pictures: *The Thin Red Line; George Stevens: A Filmmaker's Journey; John F. Kennedy: Years of Lightning, Day of Drums; The Diary of Anne Frank*. Awards include eight awards from the Writers Guild of America, two George Foster Peabody Awards, and two Emmys.
